Food Policy

Purpose

Montessori STARS ensures that children receive nutritional food at an appropriate time to meet their health needs and in a safe manner. We are also committed to ensuring a high level of hygiene is maintained while preparing, serving and storing food. We keep records of the food served. Where food is provided by parents, the service encourages and promotes healthy eating guidelines.

TE WHĀRIKI Well-being/ Mana atua - Goal 1: Tamariki experience an environment where their health is promoted.

Issue Outline - Montessori STARS have an obligation to uphold the health, safety and wellbeing of all children by ensuring the service meets the nutritional needs of children in their care or alternatively encourages parents to do so. Montessori STARS have an obligation to ensure that our practices align with the Food Act 2014 regulations.

Procedures:

Montessori STARS takes into account the full nutritional needs of children. We ask parents to declare any known allergies on their enrolment form and document accordingly.

- Montessori STARS keeps a record of all food and ingredients served during the service's hours of operation (other than that provided by parents for their own children). Our records show the type of food provided and the ingredients and are available for inspection for three months after the food is served. Where food is provided by parents to be shared, a written list of all of the food and the ingredients provided for children is documented in our daily diary on that day.
- [☆]We have set mealtimes but make allowances for children who are demonstrably hungry or for medical/personal reasons, require a specialised diet and eating time.
- Montessori STARS is guided by a range of resources available to help ECE services make healthy and informed choices about food provided to children, and to encourage parents to do the same.
- [☆]Parents provide food for their child to eat while attending Montessori STARS.
- [☆]Where parents provide lunch for their child, we ensure their lunch box is clearly labelled.
- **☆We are a nut and egg free centre.**
- An ample supply of water that is fit to drink is available to children at all times, and older children are able to access this water independently using the child size sink and taps.
- There will be times that children will be included in the preparation of food as a curriculum related activity. Where this occurs, all the above precautions will be taken and recorded.

Food Act 2014: Self-Supply Water at Places used for Food¹

We only use clean water for the purpose of food production, processing and handling and do not use self supplied water.

Montessori STARS

Parents provide morning tea, lunch and afternoon tea for their child while attending. We are therefore exempt from conditions under the Food Act 2014 however we are still expected to meet licensing criteria and ensure food is safe. Self supply water means water from sources such as bore water, rainwater, surface water, or ground water obtained directly by the operator. This is distinct from water supplied by an independent supplier (including a public or private supplier).

Background (including legislation/regulation references)

Licensing Criteria 2008, Health and Safety Regulations

HS19: a record of all food served during the service's hours of operation (other than that provided by parents for their own children). Records show the type of food provided, and are available for inspection for three months after the food is served.

DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED: A record of all food served during the service's hours of operation (other than that provided by parents for their own children). Records show the type of food provided and are available for inspection for 3 months after the food is served

HS20: Food is prepared, served, and stored hygienically.

HS21: An ample supply of water that is fit to drink is available to children at all

times, and older children are able to access this water independently.

HS22: Children are supervised and seated while eating. Where food is provided by the service, foods that pose a high choking risk are not to be served unless prepared in accordance with best practice as set out in *Ministry of Health: Reducing food-related choking for babies and young children at early learning services*. Where food is provided by parents, the service promotes best practices as set out in Ministry of Health: Reducing food-related choking for babies and young children at early learning services and must provide to all parents at the time of enrolment a copy of Ministry of Health: Reducing food-related choking for babies and young children at early learning services.
